



## What is the Concord Street Planning Study?

South St. Paul



The City of South St. Paul, Dakota County, City of St. Paul, and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) are jointly developing a planning study for the

Concord Street Corridor from I-494 to Annapolis Street in South St. Paul to determine an overall vision for the corridor in advance of the proposed MnDOT pavement resurfacing, drainage upgrades, and pedestrian accommodations in 2019.

## How Can I Participate in the Project?

Please consider attending an informal open house, where staff will introduce the project, answer questions, and solicit your input. The City and project management team is interested in hearing your suggestions and concerns on the following elements:

- » **Need for bicycle facilities (on- and off-road)**
- » **On-street parking needs for businesses and residents**
- » **Need for roadway capacity and safety improvements**
- » **Pedestrian safety and connectivity**
- » **Beautification of the corridor (landscaping/urban design elements)**

This is an informal open house meeting. No presentation will be given. Your input will help ensure the planning team develops a comprehensive understanding of the issues along the corridor from those who use Concord Street every day. Maps and more information will be available for review.
